- e. COPE: oil severance fee to fund education?
 - i. AB1481: 15% extraction fee to directly fund education—K-12, Community Colleges, Universities
 - 1. PH opposed. CFT has not endorsed. Concerns:
 - a. That this money would take the state off the hook for educational funding
 - b. That its direct link to education creates divisiveness between education and other interests
 - 2. Local 2121, SF City is endorsing it
 - a. Our decision: Send out info to membership and hold off on a decision until we see how effort unfolds
