IV. Leadership Teams

- a. Main goals of CCFT this semester: 1) to develop and implement effective strategies that respond to budget realities and reflect constituency values and input and, 2) to advocate for additional state revenue.
- b. Leadership teams met and reported back:

i. Budget & Negotiations

The team is considering net ending balance (NEB), faculty share of expenses, long-term budget planning. Possible NEB floor of 7.6% discussed.

ii. Faculty Input & Dialogue

- 1. Planning for Burrito Bash: Friday, May 4
- 2. CFT Convention: Outreach to divisions and coordination of carpools.
- 3. Outreach around Millionaires Tax
- 4. Student Success Task Force: Need to think about state advocacy readverse impacts. Internally: voice in implementation for student success.

iii. Contract Education & Support

- Preparing for negotiation of the entire contract next year (contract development). Will likely conduct two surveys: the first fairly open, the second more specific. Additional outreach to adjuncts may be needed, as there are issues with email.
- 2. Contract Education: will be looking at evaluation & assignments.

iv. Solidarity & Community

- 1. All reps asked to complete a "Commitment Card" and to get at least one other faculty member to complete as well.
- 2. We just received petitions for the Millionaires Tax. Team will work on training, education and outreach efforts. Petitions distributed for all to sign.

 - i. CFT Leadership Conference included workshops on the budget & net ending balance, Millionaires Tax, and forming a retiree chapter. Maya will reach out to retirees to see if there is interest in forming a chapter; a preliminary goal is to plug retirees into political organizing efforts.

District would like half of the 2.5 mil reduction to come from concessions; other half to come from classified and management jobs. Classified could be looking at reductions of up to 27 full-time equivalent employees.
